The chart will show how we must report withdrawals for students in Ohio schools, both brick-and-mortar and online.

No-Show Returning Student (Rolled Over)	Does Not Show Within 15 Days – Student is Withdrawn	7/2/2024	Usually 41, 40, 42
No-Show Brand-New Student or Previously Withdrawn in a Prior Year & Reentering	Does Not Show Within 15 Days – Student is Withdrawn	7/2/2024	81
No-Show Brand-New Student – During School Year	Does Not Show Within 15 Days – Student is Withdrawn	7/2/2024	81
Student Has Been Attending	Withdraws After School Has Started	The Day After Their Last Present Day in School	Usually 41, 40, 42
Student Has Been Attending Then is Absent/72 Hour Rule	Withdrawn For 72 Hours Consecutive Unexcused Absences (Leave the Absences)	Day After They Hit 72 Hours	76

Ohio Department of Education & Workforce tells us that Summer Withdrawals (those who withdraw from school between 7/1 and the first day of school) must be out of the school calendar. They always have said to use 7/1. In PowerSchool we must use the next date, 7/2 but it extracts out into the state reporting files as 7/1, and 7/1 is what gets reported to the state.
